Description of Services:

Adventures in Learning k-12 (AIL) is a skills development and intervention program for at-risk students. AIL utilizes a holistic approach to learning using one-on-one tutoring as its primary means of improving student academic success. One-on-one tutoring is offered mainly at the student's home but sessions can also take place at any location deemed safe by both parent and tutor. AIL employs many tutors so session times and locations are very flexible. Tutoring begins with a Pre-test which is used to determine a student's strengths and weaknesses. Once the Pre-test is evaluated by our staff an individually tailored program is created for that student. Parents are also encouraged to be involved in the tutoring process to help ensure learning is a daily occurrence in the child's home. AIL tutors work closely with a student's classroom teacher to guarantee classroom work is reinforced during tutoring sessions. Additionally, bilingual tutors are available for weekly tutoring sessions as well and are proficient in several languages including: Spanish, French, German, Japanese and many others. Social workers, peer counselors, and academic counselors are on hand to aid families in improving the academic performance of their student(s).
