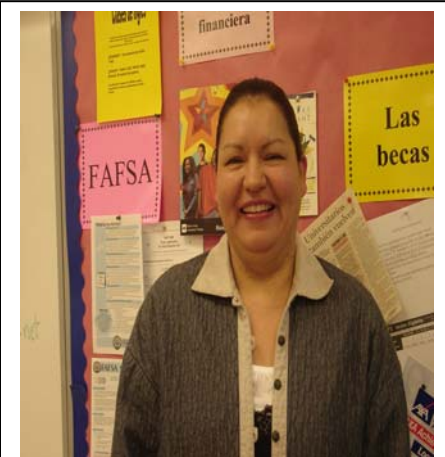
A nine-week course that orients Latino parents to the United States school system. This program created at the University of Arlington by Professor Jaime Nisstháuz covers the following topics:

- Financial aid

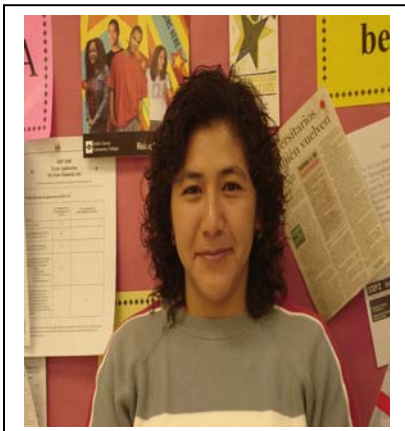
This year we have a new curriculum that focuses on the direct application of learned material.
