- Initiate individual and small group instructional practices to provide additional learning time for all students.
- Teachers will support students in the remote and/or in person classroom (ie: small group), and /or before and/or after school tutoring when necessary.
- Communicate and provide parents with resources, strategies, and information to help students succeed.
- Conferences will be held on district directed days.

- Phone conversations and home visits are encouraged throughout the year.
- Staff will respond to phone calls, emails, notes, etc. within 24 hours.
