Goal

Townley Elementary recognizes that a child's education is a duty that is shared by the school and family. For our children to succeed, it is vital for all students, parents, families, community members, and staff to work together in a partnership. Our Goal through the Parent and Family Engagement Policy is to explain how Townley Elementary will support the important role families' play in the education of their children.

Explanation of Title 1

Because a particular percentage of Townley Elementary students are considered low income, the entire school is listed as a Title 1 School. Our school receives "Title 1 Funds" (federal money) to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs to help maximize our students' success. All Title 1 schools are required to implement a Parent and Family Engagement Policy. The policy is to outline an intentional plan for Parent and Family engagement. This document fulfills the State's requirement.

Annual Title 1 Meeting

An annual meeting will be held to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, to explain the Title I requirements, and the right of parents to be involved. Townley Elementary will invite all parents and will encourage them to attend.

Parent Meetings and Involvement

Parents will be involved in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's Parent & Family Engagement Policy, and in the development of our school-wide program in an organized, positive, and ongoing way.

Opportunities for individual parent meetings will be provided at the parent's request to give suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children.
